Forensic Science Book Report/Case Study Presentation

For this assignment, you will be required to read a book that involves a criminal case in which forensic science played a key role in solving. This assignment not only ties in with the forensic science standards, but also with the common core state standards for reading and writing in the content area of science. The expectation for this assignment is that YOU become the expert on this case; you are the owner of the knowledge about this case and should be able to tell the class what you know from memory.

Below you will find an outline to help guide you as you read through your book. Filling it in as you read will help when it comes to creating your presentation for the class. Additionally, there is a point break down to allow you to see what I am looking for when it comes to grading your presentation.

Throughout the length of this project, you will be given 4 check-in dates when you will need to turn in a reading reflection so that I can determine if you are on track and how you are progressing through the project. These will be counted **as part of your project grade** so please make sure that you keep up (i.e. you should not wait until the night before it's due to start reading your book to complete the reflection). Procrastination is not going to work for this assignment. I realize that you all have many other responsibilities, which is why I am giving you plenty of time to work on this. Additionally, we will be implementing an in-class reading time to allow you time to read and work on this during the school day.

Your final presentation can be of any format that you choose (a PowerPoint, a Prezi, a poster, a display board, a website, video, etc.). There will be guidelines for the presentation in the rubric below and as long as the required components are there, you will get credit regardless of how you chose to present it. Presentations will begin before winter break and will resume after winter break. Make sure that you stay on track by following the timeline for the project.

Presentation Requirements

Your presentation should be focused around your visual aid (your PowerPoint, display board, etc.) You are expected to give a presentation (not just read off of your slides or board). Remember: you are the expert on this case. You should be able to give the audience enough information about the case that they do not have questions at the end. If they do have questions, you should be able to answer them.

Visual Aid (20pts) Must include the following: A visual timeline of major events throughout the case. 5pts Visual representations of artifacts/evidence/people from the case, for example, a copy of the ransom note, photos from the crime scene or of evidence collected, pictures of the victim/suspect, etc. 5 pts Diagram(s) of the crime scene(s)/other important places relevant to the crime. 5 pts Brief explanations/text about the case. 5pts

Timeline (15pts) Describe the suspects behavior leading up to the crime. Was the crime premeditated or a crime of passion? What events led to the suspect to commit the crime? If serial killer, what led to his first murder? How was he/she not caught? A psychological profile on the criminal(s). 5 pts
