Tsutomu Miyazaki

- Born on August 21, 1962 in Tokyo, Japan.
- Miyazaki was premature at birth, he suffered from deformity in his hands and weighing at only 4.8 lb.
- Miyazaki was an outcast from his peers, so he became obsessed with reading comic books.
- Miyazaki excelled in his education, until high school when his grades dropped dramatically.
- 1988, Miyazaki's grandfather passed away who was his only favorite family member, and his death worsened his depression. He later ate his ashes.
- He had an obsession with watching a lot of Japanese porn, a total of 5763 videos and reading a lot of comic books.



Victims

- He was accounted for a total of 4 murders.
- August 22, 1988; Miyazaki's first victim being a 4 year old girl named Mari Konno.
- October 3, 1988; second victim, Masami Yoshizawa 7 years old.
- December 12, 1988; third victim, Erika Namba, 4 years old.
- June 6, 1989; his last victim, Ayako Nomoto, 5 years old.
- Strangled his victims to death.
- The victim's families all received silent phone calls and postcards describing the murders.

- Miyazaki abducted young girls, driving a black
 Nissan Langley.
- Murders took place in west of Tokyo in a wooded area.
- Miyazaki would sexually molest his victim's corpse.
- Took photographs of his victims and their clothes.
- Miyazaki choice of getting rid of the victims were by letting their bodies decompose, cremating, or dismembering.

- One of Miyazaki's victims he drank the blood from the girl's hand and ate part it.
- Miyazaki stored dismembered body parts in his closet,
 but later on scattered the many body parts in the
 woods since the police were close to identifying him.
- Miyazaki's disorders were pedophilia, necrophilia, sadism, fetishism, and cannibalism.

Tsutomu Miyazaki Caught

July 23, 1989 Miyazaki attempted to put a zoom lens into a girl's vagaina. The girl's dad caught Miyazaki in the act and fled the scene. Soon after he was arrested when he returned to his car.

Miyazaki's home was searched and 5,763 video tapes of porn, and photographs of Miyazaki's victims were found.

March 30, 1990, Miyazaki's trial began.

Miyazaki confessed of the murders, but also blamed the "Rat Man" for his crimes.

On April 14, 1997 Miyazaki was sentenced to death by hanging.

June 17, 2008 Miyazaki was hanged.
