- Started around early 2013
- Said to have 4 times as much THC in one dab than in one Joint
- THC levels up to 95% in Dabs
- Highest recorded THC in Marijuana is 33.12% (Domestic)
- and 37.20% (Non-Domestic)

Common items used by Dab users:


- □ Unbreakable Bongs

THE NEGATIVE HEALTH EFFECTS OF MARIJUANA



*Addiction in about 9% of users overall, 17% who begin use in the teen years, and 25-50% who are daily users.

Short-Term Effects:

- Impaired Coordination
- Altered Judgment
- Possible increase in Sexual behavior
- Paranoia
- Short-Term Memory

Long-Term Effects:

- Chronic Bronchitis
- Less satisfaction and achievement in Life
- Poor Education Outcome
- Altered Brain development
- Increase of Chronic Psychosis
- Cognitive Impairment

How Does It Work?

- THC travels quickly through the bloodstream. When inhaled as Dabs or Marijuana it travels directly to the brain, and lungs giving the user an almost instant high.
- HIgh lasts around 5 hours
- If eaten can last up to 12 Hours










How is Dabs analyzed and identified?

Penalty

- If **charged as a felony**, you can be facing up to three years in state prison or up to one year in jail, depending on your criminal background, the circumstances of your case, and whether or not you qualify under the recent changes to Proposition 47.
- ☐ **If charged as a misdemeanor**, you can be punished by up to one year in local county jail.

In either scenario, you may be eligible for a drug rehabilitation program that will preserve your arrest history and minimize the damage of your arrest.
